STAFF SPOTLIGHT




Mrs. Asmussen

By Spring 2024, teachers will increase effectiveness of data-based decisions using screeners (myIGDIs, FAST), formative assessments to increase the percentage of students passing classroom (Benchmark Literacy, Everyday Math, Science & Social Studies) and state summative assessments (ISASP) to 80% (Healthy Universal Instruction).

Goal 2 Focus: SEL (Social Emotional Learning)

By Spring 2023, students will develop an increased understanding and demonstrate, in a positive way, the SEL competencies of Self- Management and Social Awareness through impulse control of emotions, perspective taking & empathy, and respect for others.

Goal 3 focus: Communication

By Spring 2023, communication among staff will increase measured by daily reminder emails, weekly PLC meetings, and monthly staff meetings.


