PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the qualified voters of Black Hawk County, State of Iowa, that the combined city/school election will be held Tuesday, November 7, 2023.

Polls will open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. Voters must vote at their assigned precincts. Please read this notice carefully to determine your correct polling location. Voting locations have changed for some voters. All voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters who have changed precincts will additionally be required to provide proof of residence. A voter who cannot provide proof of identification may have their identity attested to by another voter registered in the precinct who has an approved form of identification. A person who is eligible to register to vote and vote, may register on election day by appearing in person at the polling place for the precinct in which the individual resides. The voter must complete a voter registration application, make written oath and provide acceptable proof of identity and acceptable proof of residence. Acceptable documents which can be used as proof of identity and proof of residence are very specific and substitutes will not be accepted. ELECTION FRAUD. A voter commits the crime of Election Misconduct in the First Degree if the person submits false information when registering to vote. Election misconduct in the first degree is a class "D" felony, and punishable by a fine of up to \$10,245 and/or imprisonment of up to five (5) years. Individuals with felony convictions are ineligible to vote unless their rights have been restored, including those whose voting rights have been restored by Governor Kim Reynolds's Executive Order 7 of August 5, 2020. IF YOU ARE NOT 100% SURE YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE HAS ALREADY BEEN RESTORED, REQUEST A PROVISIONAL BALLOT.

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS. Voters who are unable to provide proof of ID/residence on election day and vote a provisional ballot must come to the courthouse to provide evidence for accepting the provisional ballot before Noon Monday, November 13.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that any voter who requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write may be given assistance by a person of the voter's choice, other than the voter's employer or agent of that employer or officer or agent of the voter's union.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, in accordance with Chapter 49.53 of the Iowa Code that any voter who is physically unable to enter the polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle.

Each polling location is equipped with a ballot marking device (ExpressVote) which may assist persons with disabilities to vote more independently. The device allows voters to make their selections using an audio read-back and touchpad, or touchscreen. The touchscreen device provides magnification and reverse black and white images. Voters unable to see the screen may have the screen turned off and use only the audio read-back and touchpad features. The audio read-back feature provides all ballot instructions, choices, and selections in an audio format using headphones.

After making selections with the ballot marking device, via touch pad or touch screen, the device will mark the voter's paper ballot and the voter will insert their marked ballot in the ballot scanner used to count all ballots. The Commissioner of Elections certifies that on Election Day all polling locations are accessible by means of permanent or temporary measures.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, in accordance with Chapter 50.51(5) of the Iowa Code that a post-election audit will be conducted at noon on Thursday, November 9 in the Black Hawk County Auditor's Office.

Public Measure BL-City of Elk Run Heights

Shall the city of Evansdale, in the County of Black Hawk, State of Iowa, change the term of office for the council members from two (2) year to four (4) year staggered terms pursuant to Iowa Code 376.2, effective January 1, 2024?

Public Measure BK-City of Evansdale

Shall the term of Library Board members for the Evansdale Public Library be reduced from six (6) to three (3) years of service?

NOTICE OF LOCAL OPTION TAX ELECTION

On November 7, 2023, an election will be held in Black Hawk County, Iowa, to vote on the question of imposition of a local sales and service tax in the cities of Cedar Falls, Dunkerton, Elk Run Heights, Evansdale, Gilbertville, Hudson, La Porte City, Raymond, Waterloo and the unincorporated area of Black Hawk County. The ballot proposition to be voted upon at the election will include the following information:

Type of tax:	Local Sales and Service Tax
Rate of tax:	1% (one percent)
Date of imposition:	January 1, 2026

PUBLIC MEASURE A

In the City of Cedar Falls revenue is to be used: 0% for property tax relief. The specific purposes for which the revenues will otherwise be expended are: one hundred percent (100%) for reconstruction/repair/replacement of existing streets, curbs, structures, storm sewers and sanitary sewers as they relate to streets within the corporate limits of the City of Cedar Falls, Iowa.

In the City of Elk Run Heights revenue is to be used: 0% for property tax relief. The specific purposes for which the revenues will otherwise be expended are: one hundred percent (100%) for Capital Improvement and/or Capital Improvement Debt Reduction. Public capital improvements shall include city streets, curbs, bridges, storm sewer, sanitary sewer, water, buildings, equipment, and parks and recreational facilities.

In the City of Evansdale revenue is to be used: 30% for property tax relief. The specific purposes for which the revenues will otherwise be expended are: fifty percent (50%) for repair, replacement, maintenance, creation or reconstruction of city streets, curbs, bridges, storm sewer, sanitary sewer, buildings and facilities. Twenty percent (20%) for capital expansion, capital improvements, and capital equipment to be used for library, park and recreation, fire, police, public works, and policy/administration departments capital needs.

In the City of Hudson revenue is to be used: 0% for property tax relief. The specific purposes for which the revenues will otherwise be expended are: one hundred percent (100%) for expenditures within the Public Safety, Public Works, Health and Social Services, Culture and Recreation, Community and Economic Development, or General Government categories of the annual City Budget.

In the City of Raymond revenue is to be used: 0% for property tax relief. The specific purposes for which the revenues will otherwise be expended are: one hundred percent (100%) for capital improvements and/or capital improvement debt reduction.
